What's the NZBN?

- A globally unique identifier.
- Part of a single, searchable register for **all Kiwi businesses**.
- Enables all businesses to interact more easily with government and each other.
- A link to core business information.






What is core business information?

Your NZBN links to information you're most likely to be asked to share with other businesses and government agencies so they can work with you.

Includes:

- -trading name
- -phone numbers
- -addresses
- -website
- status
- GST number (optional for some businesses).





Why another number?

- A single register for all Kiwi businesses.
- Other numbers meet other needs.
- Response to business sector.
- Part of government's digital commitment .

• Globally unique and compatible.

Benefits to your business

- > Staying connected and informed
- > **Time and cost savings** unique identifier, one register, potential to integrate with your system.
- Increased efficiency and accuracy central source, up-to-date reliable information, automated updates.
- More informed decision-making increased knowledge and confidence.
- Future-focused enabler of digital initiatives (such as e-invoicing), globally compatible.

Making information public

- > Much of your core business information is already public (website or Companies Register) - NZBN connects the dots and makes it digitally accessible.
- > Easier to interact and transact.
- Some entities can choose to keep some of their core business information private.
- > The more information an NZBN owner makes publicly available, the more everyone can stay up-to-date.

Getting started with NZBN is easy

- 1. Get your NZBN. Find or get your NZBN on the NZBN website.
- 2. Share your NZBN. Add it to your invoices, receipts, email signatures and letterheads.
- **3.** Identify your business. Use your NZBN to identify yourself when interacting or transacting with other businesses or government.
- 4. Check your database. Identify the businesses you already work with by their NZBN. Use our free data matching service to help match your customers or suppliers to their NZBN and identify outdated data.
- 5. Ask for the NZBN. Ask new customers or suppliers for their NZBN during the sign-up process. When interacting or transacting with current customers or suppliers, ask for their NZBN.
- 6. Set up a watchlist or use our API. Receive automatic updates of changes to the core information about businesses you interact with.

FREE NZBN services

Watchlist Select businesses to follow and receive automated updates when information changes. Data matching Clean your database, matching NZBN information to data you already hold on other businesses.

NZBN API Connect your business system using the NZBN API to automate timeconsuming manual work. Bulk data Check your business data against a monthly download of all businesses on the NZBN Register.



Digital Procurement and e-Invoicing

Current Invoicing Landscape in New Zealand

New Zealand businesses generate more than 280 million Business to Business invoices each year but they suffer from:

- > inefficiencies through manual handling
- > unreliable or unsafe delivery processes with limited receipt visibility
- > longer than necessary processing or payment times with many invoices more than a month overdue
- > data entry errors when scanned or keyed
- > addressing issues where invoices go to the wrong recipient
- > increasing numbers of invoice scams and fraud.






What is e-Invoicing?

- > E-Invoices are sent digitally system to system no keying, clicking, uplifting, scanning, printing...
- > A global framework allows invoices to be exchanged between different financial systems
- > Delivery is via service providers like sending a text message
- > Enabled by the New Zealand Business Number (NZBN)
- > Has receipting capability, you get confirmation of invoice delivery
- > Mandated in many countries for business to government







NZBN More business AV Less work

Benefits of e-Invoicing

E-Invoicing offers a solution that all businesses can access and benefit from, regardless of their size, and the financial management system they use.

The benefits include:

- Faster and easier delivery, processing and payment
- Cost savings est. \$7.63 vs \$25.67 paper and \$23.01 PDF
- Fewer errors improves data quality and reduces delays
- Direct and secure reduces the risk of fake or compromised invoices
- Focus on business with less time on admin
- Supports cross-border trade using a proven international framework





New Zealand moving to e-Invoicing

- > We're taking a Trans- Tasman approach to e-Invoicing
- February 2019 Decision to join the Pan-European Public
 Procurement On-Line (PEPPOL) interoperability framework
- > March 2019 New Zealand became a member of PEPPOL
- > September 2019 New Zealand established as a local PEPPOL Authority
- October 2019 Service Providers begin being certified to send New Zealand e-Invoices
- > From December 2019 New Zealand businesses can exchange e-Invoices



How could e-Invoicing impact you/your clients?

- > Time savings no keying, clicking, uplifting, scanning, printing, chasing to see if an invoice arrived
- > Disputes dealt with earlier
- > Government looking to pay e-Invoices more quickly
- > Good for cash flow
- > Australia/New Zealand common invoicing
- > Other e-Procurement documents coming soon
 - e-Purchase Orders, e-Shipping-notifications etc








Get going with e-Invoicing

- > 3 main ways to send and receive an e-Invoice:
 - Software can create an invoice in a standard format
 - > Translation services can convert your invoice to the standard format
 - > E-Invoicing Service Provider has a portal to input your invoice
- > Identify what your system can do now, and what additional services you will need
- > Talk to Service Provider to understand your options , and select the best option for your business
- > Determine what will happen in your systems when an e-Invoice arrives, and how it sends
- > Contact your suppliers and customers to get them on-board with your move to e-Invoicing
